- Editing (JOUR23): Students strengthen news judgment, critical thinking and writing through careful editing for accuracy, fairness and clarity, including use of AI, proper spelling, grammar, usage and style. Practice in multimedia presentation of content.
- Journalism Practicum (JOUR 232): An internship for department majors is a practical experience course in journalism, science writing or public relations. It is a capstone course that provides work experience and employment contacts.
- Opinion and Persuasive Writing (JOUR 196): This class helps students understand how to research, write and revise columns with an emphasis on the importance of audience and platform. It teaches students how to develop journalistic skills as they craft compelling

narratives, as well as how to write clearly, concisely, and persuasively, while also honing a unique voice and perspective. This course also improves students' research and critical thinking abilities, as well as the ability to interview sources and fact-check information.
